VI. Return to School: A Community Conversation (Terri Payne)

- Goal to gather thoughts and concerns from parents about returning to school
- Review of metrics required to go back to school
- Mcps collecting our information, then sending to the principals to determine how to implement the responses that parents have provided
 - Teachers could change, schools could change
- General themes of concern brought up at meeting
 - School consistency
 - Parents who would consider sending kids back might change minds if child goes to different school/outside of the cluster
 - School consistency is more important for vocal majority than the amount of time that students could be in class (e.g. if student could do 4 days a week at Wood Acres, or only 2 days a week at BES, most parents seem to choose 2 days at BES)
 - Keeping teacher
 - Survey responses re: transportation would change if school assignments change
